Prior to his appointment at MGI Beinhocker was a partner at McKinsey and a co-leader of the Firm's global strategy practice where he served clients in the industrial, energy, and telecommunications sectors. He has also held academic research appointments at the Harvard Business School, the MIT Sloan School, been a visiting scholar at the Santa Fe Institute, and an executive director of the Corporate Executive Board. He is a graduate of Dartmouth College and the MIT Sloan School where he was the Henry Ford II Scholar.

Beinhocker writes extensively on economic and business issues and his work has appeared in the *Financial Times*, *Newsweek*, *Harvard Business Review* and various academic journals. He is the author *The Origin of Wealth*, one of Amazon's "Top Ten Business Books" in 2006.

Beinhocker's recent work for the McKinsey Global Institute has included topics such as the rise of India and China, and the future of US savings and consumption after the financial crisis. He is also a co-leader of McKinsey's climate change and sustainability practice, and is currently leading efforts on national and international climate regulation, and the economics of transitioning to a low-carbon economy.
